



Committee at University of Connecticut wants more oversight of construction spending

From *The Hartford Courant*: Hoping to avoid another surprise like the costly renovation of **Gulley Hall**, members of a **University of Connecticut** trustee committee [are taking steps to ensure that any such building projects will come before them](#). The trustees' committee wants any renovation or building project initiated by the university president to be presented to them. In the past, only projects of \$500,000 or more had to go before the committee. The concern was prompted by the \$450,000 renovation of Gulley Hall, where President Michael Hogan's office is housed, along with the purchase of \$39,000 in furniture for the office.
